

Frequently Asked Questions about Acrylocks

What size are Acrylocks?

The dimensions of each Acrylocks block are 200 x 200 x 38 mm.

Can Acrylocks be used outdoors?

Yes. Acrylocks can be used for internal or external walls, as pool surrounds, fencing, or gates. You are only limited by your imagination.

Can Acrylocks be used in wet areas?

Yes. Acrylocks are perfect for wet areas due to their double walled construction and double sided seals. This means that they won't fog up with condensation, and give you privacy with lots of natural light.

Are Acrylocks secure?

Yes. Acrylocks are more secure than glass which can easily be broken to gain access to your property. Acrylocks blocks only be removed if you have access to both sides of your installed Acrylocks panel.

Can I walk on Acrylocks?

No. Acrylocks are not designed to be walked on.

Are Acrylocks structural? Can they be used for load bearing walls?

No. Like glass Acrylocks are not designed to be load bearing.

Are Acrylocks fire resistant?

Yes. Acrylocks are fire resistant and meet the international standards for this type of product.

Can Acrylocks panels be relocated?

Yes. Acrylocks panels can be easily removed and reinstalled provided you have access to both sides of your Acrylocks panel.

Can damaged blocks be replaced once fitted?

Yes. Acrylocks blocks can be individually replaced once installed provided you have access to both sides of your Acrylocks panel.

Can Acrylocks be lit?

Yes. Acrylocks look stunning with any type of back lighting, or you can use coloured flood lighting for a dramatic effect.

Can Acrylocks be cut for circular designs?

Yes. Acrylocks can be cut using a band-saw into shape as required.

Can Acrylocks be used for curved walls?

Yes. Acrylocks can be used in straight or curved designs.

Can Acrylocks be fitted into sliding doors?

Yes. Acrylocks have been designed specifically for use in doors, windows, skylights and more.
